Camp Cedars



Located on the south bank of the Platte River near Fremont, Nebraska, Cedars provides long-term camping experience for over 2,400 campers each summer. Activities at camp include archery, rifle and shotgun shooting, nature, scoutcraft, COPE, swimming, boating, biking, horseback riding and canoeing. It also hosts three sessions of Webelos camp and our Wood Badge training every year.

Little Sioux

Located approximately 40 miles north of Omaha off of Interstate 29, Little Sioux Scout Reservation serves as a very popular camp for both District Camporees and Scout Unit camping. In addition to well-marked and maintained trails that can be used for hiking, backpacking, or cross-country skiing, campers have a choice of several mowed meadows, with nearby frost-free water hydrants and latrines or several remote campsites. Four cabin shelters are also available year-round to camping groups, as is an administration building with cooking facilities. A 15-acre lake is available for boating and fishing. A rifle range was recently added.



Thomas Ashford

Camp Thomas Ashford Scout Reservation is located seven miles from Homer, Nebraska, off of Hwy-77. It is a large camp, over 2000 acres of wilderness, with so much to do. It was a fully equipped Scout camp, having once served as a summer camp, with campsites, pool, archery range, climbing tower, dining hall, shelters, and so much more. Ashford is also noted for its nature trails, perfect for any of the Nature Merit Badges. Ashford is used for summer cub day camps and more!

Camp Butterfield

Camp Butterfield a 160 acre camp in north central Nebraska, approximately 30 miles south of the South Dakota border. The camp is ideal for backpacking, hiking, and fishing. Partially wooded Butterfield has 3 lakes, 2 cabins, a 28 by 28 picnic shelter and 2 wells with hand pumps for drinking water (tested yearly). Each year in September, Camp Butterfield serves as host to the annual Mid-America Council Rendezvous.

Camp Wakonda

Camp Wakonda, in Bellevue, Nebraska, covers 40 acres of wooded bluffs adjacent to Fontenelle Forest. The camp has 6 Adirondack style shelters and a program building. There are conveniently located latrines with water in addition to frost-free spickets that run year round. The centerpiece, the Paxton Program Building, has a furnace and a fireplace, kitchen, restroom and shower. Wakonda is the home of the Logan Fontenelle Trail, one of the BSA's historic trails. Over 10 miles of the Fontenelle Forest are accessible with the reservation fee. Wakonda is home to Cub Day Camps, Fun With Sons, Troop and Pack outings, Summer Time Pack activities and hosts many out of council units. 10 miles of the Fontenelle Forest are accessible with the reservation fees well.

Camp Eagle

A 312 acre camp on the bank of the Platte River near Fremont, Nebraska, Camp Eagle provides year round camping and outdoor activities for the youth of Mid-America Council. In the summer months, the camp is home to Cub Scout camping activities. The camp has a 5 acre lake boating and fishing, a campfire stage, a Rotary picnic shelter, B-B gun and archery ranges, and hiking trails. A variety of lodgings from cabin bunks to primitive campsites are available as well.
